

On Page 34 of 49 of enclosed Reference 2, you will find the following discussion (screenshot) :

Consistent with your COMPACT, courts have ruled that ‘behavioral expectations’ are determinative to the granting of degrees . . . especially medical degrees.

Accordingly, behavioral expectations can be deemed as determinative of degree granting or revocation. This is especially crucial regarding evidence that the medical degree applicant has demonstrated a lack-of or practice-of the professionalism that their education taught and the academy implicitly required.

The Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals deferred to the university determination that the appellee violated the behavioral expectations of professionalism with respect to the granting of his medical degree (which he otherwise had earned academically). On that basis, the court ruled that bylaws which contain original verbiage which provide operatives intended for the protection of university reputation; bylaws which are binding for degree applicants, can therefore be enforced. Operatives intended for the protection of university reputation, ranging from student expulsion to degree application rejection/revocation were ruled legal, enforceable, and proper.

I am very familiar with the bylaws of my alma mater Cornell University; I am unfamiliar with such connected to the University of California - San Diego School of Medicine.

The portent of Reference 2 was embellished, not diminished, by the recent vulgar admissions of Mr. Varma. The forwarding of this instant letter to Cornell administrators serves to remind/update them of the embellishment; specifically, Mr. Anthony Fauci and Mr. Jay Varma are intimately connected to, what many refer to as, the COVID-19 Crime Syndicate.

Given the severity and criminality of their deeds, to the best of my understanding, I am at-a-loss to project a “downside” to revocation of the medical degrees of Mr. Fauci and Mr. Varma. Given the ongoing degradation of public opinion/perception of U.S. academia, disciplinary action would in-fact serve to further the underlying reputations of the two academic/medical institutions. Again, in-general and especially in these two instances (Fauci/Varma), if there is a “downside” my limited intellect has failed to determine such.

Jay Varma is a physician and epidemiologist^[1] who is the former^[2] Executive Vice President and Chief Medical Officer of SIGA Technologies. He previously served as senior advisor for public health^[3]^[4] and COVID-19 to New York City Mayor Bill de Blasio.^[5]^[6]

In that role, Varma helped lead New York City's COVID-19 pandemic response, including diagnostic testing,^[5] contact tracing,^[7] vaccine mandates^[8] and the phased re-opening of businesses.^[9] He was the architect of the NYC plans for public schools during the COVID-19 crisis.^[10] In a 2024, a controversy arose from the release of a video recording of Varma stating that that he was involved in dance and sex parties in 2020 and 2021, with Varma stating that the video statements were "taken out of context".^[11]
